Roland Rivers III (Slippery Rock) Chosen as Offensive Player of the Year

Christopher Jefferson (Findlay) Chosen as Defensive Player of the Year



Slippery Rock University senior quarterback **ROLAND RIVERS III** (Ellenwood, Ga. / Martin Luther King) has been selected as the 2019 Super Region 1 Offensive Player of the Year.

Rivers, the PSAC West Athlete of the Year, led the nation in multiple categories this year including total offense (4,000), passing efficiency (192.7), passing touchdowns (40), and points responsible for (278), all while leading The Rock to a perfect 11-0 record and the top seed in Super Region 1. Rivers completed 72% of his passes for 3,409 yards through the air and rushed for 591 yards and six touchdowns on 126 carries.

University of Findlay sophomore safety **CHRISTOPHER JEFFERSON** (Euclid, Ohio / Benedictine) has been selected as the 2019 Super Region 1 Defensive Player of the Year.

Jefferson, the G-MAC Defensive Player of the Year, tied for the national lead, all divisions, with nine interceptions, seven of which came in a four-game stretch in the middle of the year. Those nine picks set a conference record while his three-interception game on Oct. 5 tied a conference record. He also led the conference with 1.4 passes defended per game. Jefferson also had one forced fumble and two fumble recoveries to help the Oilers to a +17 turnover margin, fourth-best in the country.
